

DACUM Facilitators Training

(Course Information)

Introduction

The purpose of this training is to provide the public and private sector organizations with valid and reliable information for specific occupations by training individuals in the DACUM process.

This training follows additional two sequential stages, both of which must be successfully completed before the individuals is certified as a DACUM Facilitators. The course will be conducted in English.

Stage I consists of a three- week training course. The trainings require full time attendance and active participation of all the participants.

Stage II consists of a two-week training course in which participants are required to conduct an actual DACUM workshop under the close supervision of a TITI trainer/facilitators. In addition, participants are required to observe and evaluate the workshop conducted by peers and critique the DACUM charts prepared by others.

Stage III consists of submitting an additional DACUM chart from DACUM workshop planned and conducted by the participants individually within one year of the completion of the second stage of DACUM Facilitators Training.
